POSITION OVERVIEW:

The Workshop Volunteer supports the community team in providing general assistance for our independent volunteers and groups working off our Jobs Board. They are also required to provide support around equipment usage across our workshop areas under the supervision of Farm staff.

The Workshop Volunteer has the necessary practical and theoretical skills, acquired through training, qualifications, experience or a combination of these, to safely and competently operate a broad range of power tools and woodworking plant / equipment.

RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES:

- Support groups and individuals attending the Farm and its community programs, ensuring participants are supported and engaged and that Farm programs are inclusive, engaging and aligned with the Farm's social mission.
- Assist in sanitising and maintaining equipment for community volunteers use
- Engage with people of all ages, backgrounds and abilities with courtesy and respect, ensuring all program participants feel welcome and supported.
- Employ their practical and theoretical skills to assist with a range of on-ground tasks.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- An excellent communicator and relationship builder, you are calm under pressure, adaptable, quick to form rapport with program participants and able to effectively manage conflict resolution.
- You have the necessary practical and theoretical skills, acquired through training, qualifications, experience or a combination of these, to safely and competently operate a broad range of power tools and woodworking plant / equipment.
- Understanding of the practice and policy issues related to at-risk youth (including but not limited to Youth Justice, CALD, OOHC, trauma, homelessness). Desirable
- Possess a 'can-do', hard-working, fun and innovative attitude towards work.
- Have a current working with children check.
